22. Introducing the UN Sustainable Development Goals (part 2)

The United Nations, which is often called the 'UN', is an international organisation founded in 1945. Its member countries have acted together to ensure global peace and security since the end of the Second World War. Since it was established, the UN has always set targets and goals for each of its members to meet and uphold. The most recent goals set by the UN include the SDGs. These were introduced in 2015 with the intention of securing the UN's long-lasting goals of peace and security, with an added emphasis on being more sustainable and ensuring countries are actively thinking about tackling matters such as climate change.
